## Boonerang funding request (Mark Fried)

Will be requesting \$10,000 sponsorship in the near future; Total festival cost expected to be \$100,000

### Discussion:

Last year expected 4,000 people; believe attendance closer to 7,000

Feedback indicated people felt the festival was “a gift to locals.”

This year will include more opportunities for restaurants and shops to be involved.

- Theater will be involved this year.
- Adding Farmers’ parking lot and alley and Wildcraft parking lot as activity areas
- Expanding Friday night activity to encourage hotel stays

Any concern that a large sponsorship in the future might change character/ruin the festival?

Any negative feedback? Some wanted more communication in advance, one didn’t appreciate being asked to sponsor

## First Friday Buskers fest Request (Watauga Arts Council / Paige Henderson)

Watauga Arts Council requesting \$1,000, which is approximately half of the total First Friday budget for 2022/23. Note: DBDA Promotions Committee had planned to have 3 signature events to include buskers and artists on first Fridays.

Priority for membership is MSD members

### Promotion/Design Committee Updates (Megan)

- Goal – define social media strategy
- Next committee meeting will create a social media calendar for board to review
- No longer using White Blaze
- Operational plan: Paige writes posts; Laney schedules and posts to various sites
- Potentially create “First Friday Art Crawl” logo
- Moved sculpture from Melanies to town hall
- Wayne Trapp sculpture – public works will paint, have been given paint information

### Economic Vitality: Review Economic Development and Implantation Plan (Paige)

Today’s Goal – review 2021 -22 plan; begin to think “where do we need to adjust priorities?”

What are examples of measurable goals that we can achieve?

### Discussion of Street Vendors

Issue: Vendors becoming excessive, can create an unwelcoming environment. No criteria for appropriateness of wares. Nothing to limit vendors from creating a competing business.

Vendors were previously registered as itinerate merchants; the state of NC abolished this. Currently unregulated. Need outline of reasonable enforcement, Town Council is requesting guidance from DBDA based on input from MSD businesses.

Any text amendment to UDO must come from Town Council

#### *For further DBDA discussion of street vendors*

- Is permitting appropriate?
- What is the budget to enforce regulation? Could permit fee fund regulation?
- Vendors can be ambassadors for the town
- How many are collecting and paying sales tax
- How do we address buskers which bring vibrancy and tradition?
- Blocking sidewalk = safety concerns; this can be and is addressed

### Food Trucks

Also needs to be addressed; sidewalk vendor is more urgent need
