

Residential Water Audit Tips



- Checking For Leaks (Indoor and Outdoor)
 - Use dye tablets to check for toilet leaks (available at the Public Utilities office).
 - Turn off faucet and place a glass under the faucet, check the glass in 15 minutes. If you have even 1 cup of water, that can equal 300 gallons a month.
 - Inspect hoses and sprinklers to make sure there are no leaks.
 - Look for standing water in the surface near irrigation system spray head. If you see areas of the lawn that are a brighter green than others, you may have a leak.
- Use Garbage Disposal sparingly. Compost vegetable food waste and save gallons every time.
- Adjust your lawn mower to a higher setting. A taller lawn shades roots and holds soil moisture better than if closely clipped.
- Use sprinklers for large areas of grass and water small spaces by hand. Also, make sure that you are watering the grass and not the driveway or patio.
- Collect water from your roof in a rain barrel to water your garden.
- Don't use running water to defrost food. Defrost food in the refrigerator for water efficiency and food safety.
- Use a water-efficient showerhead. They are inexpensive, easy to install, and can save you up to 750 gallons a month.
- Turn off the water while you shave and save up to 300 gallons a month.
- When you give your pet fresh water, don't pour the old water down the drain. Use it to water plants,trees or shrubs.
